English words ending with "th" usually correspond to "ス" in katakana.

Example:	<i>Smith</i>	スミス
	<i>Keith</i>	キース
	<i>booth</i>	ブース

English words ending with "s" usually correspond to "ス" in katakana.

Example:	<i>yes</i>	イエス
	<i>kiss</i>	キス
	<i>miss</i>	ミス

English words ending with "p" usually correspond to "プ" in katakana.
